

## College and University news

**Governor Jesse Ventura has recommended \$86 million of the University's \$239.8 million budget request in his proposed capital budget**, announced Jan. 14. This includes \$35 million of the \$80 million Higher Education Asset Preservation and Replacement (HEAPR) request and \$3.4 million of the \$18.7 million request for plant growth facilities on the St. Paul campus. The U's HEAPR request includes \$27 million for utility infrastructure needed for construction of the planned Biotechnology Precinct. The Governor's recommendations will be reviewed by the Legislature when the session convenes on Jan. 29. The University will present the full request of \$239.8 million to the Legislature and continue to advocate for the request in its entirety. **Gary Nelsestuen**, biochemistry, molecular biology, and biophysics, received an Outstanding Minnesota Inventor award from the Minnesota Intellectual Property Law Association. His design of an anti-clotting protein has been licensed to Eli Lilly as a treatment for septic shock. He has also designed an improved version of clotting factor VII, a drug that could potentially reduce treatment costs for hemophilia.

**David Thomas**, biochemistry, molecular biology, and biophysics, is co-investigator on a \$1.8 million, five-year NIH grant to study the cellular mechanisms underlying age-related muscle weakness.
